6. Town Deal Investment Panel	
a) SW presented provided the Board with an update on the Town Deal Investment Panel on 23 rd June at which presentations were given on the Blackpool Central Courts Relocation and the illuminations schemes.	
b) The Board noted the minutes of the 7 th May Community Renewal Fund Assessment meeting (the outcome of which was reported to the last Board) and the minutes of the 23 rd June.	
7. Community Engagement Update	
a) PW provided an update on community engagement.	
 Engagement plans now in place for each of the projects, which will be developed and implemented by project managers with support from the Infusion team. 	
 Sixty responses received from the Youth Hub online digital survey, which was co-produced with young people. A weekly focus group took place over a period of five weeks to research and gain young peoples' experiences of the barriers to employment and how the Youth Hub could address these. 	
 Blackpool currently recruiting youth employment advisors. Advisors will be young people that have experience of not being in traineeship/ education employment. Advisors will form part of a Youth Advisory Board. 	
 Illuminations – Engagement will include reaching out to community members and organisations that represent and support people to have their voices and opinions heard, to design a piece of work for the illuminations. 	
 Infusion survey has been shortened and training has been developed to allow Blackpool Council colleagues to work with community organisations to ensure all members of the community are given the option to engage. 	
 Residents living adjacent to the illuminations will be consulted and informed prior to illuminations being installed.

8.	Blackpool Airport Enterprise Zone	
a)	Rob Green gave an introductory presentation on the Enterprise Zone prior to the presentation of a full business case which will go through the TDIP before it comes back to the Board for approval on 8 th October.	
b)	The following was noted:	
	 Enterprise status received in 2015. Considered vital part of Blackpool's economic strategy plan with focus on new inward investment and expansion of existing Fylde Coast businesses. Enable the generation of 5000 jobs. Target sectors include aviation, food, energy and digital/ creative manufacturing. New industrial area, access and repurposing of existing buildings planned. Expired aviation facilities to be relocated nearer to operational runway to release land for development. New sports pitches created and will be in use by September. £7.5M requested from Town Deal funding. All new buildings to include electric vehicle charging points. 9.	Blackpool Central Courts Relocation	
a)	lan Morris-Iliffe gave an introductory presentation on the Blackpool Central Courts relocation project prior to the presentation of a full business case which will go through the TDIP before it comes back to the Board for approval on $1^{2\text{th}}$ November.	
b)	 The following was noted: Currently located adjacent to the promenade. Police facilities acquired by Blackpool Council in 2018.

 Existing court facilities in poor condition and will be demolished to make way for Blackpool Central project. £8M Town Deal funding request - £3M contribution to surrender of existing HMCTS lease and new facilities. £5M to demolish existing building and remediate land. Devonshire Road is proposed relocation for new courts which will enable the completion of the Blackpool Central scheme. Blackpool Central project will enhance town offer with an all year around attraction and will bring in investment and new jobs. Development will include a world class leisure attractions, new hotel, food/ drink units' public area and café. Structural engineers appointed to oversee demolition of existing courts.

10. Illuminations	
 Richard Williamson gave an introductory presentation on the Blackpool Illuminations project prior to the presentation of a full business case which will go through the TDIP before it comes back to the Board for approval on 10th September. 	
 b) The following points were noted: Maintenance of existing illuminations and installation of new small scale pieces have been funded by savings within the service and sponsorship. Town Deal funding will be used to deliver a three-kilometre infrastructure upgrade, extended seasons (2021 -2025), investment in new vehicles and new illumination art pieces, which will be integrated into the town centre to give a more flexible infrastructure. Up to three 'more complex' features will be installed each year with input from established artists and the illumination team. Some existing features will be upgraded. Features will be more interactive. Golden Mile will include digital neon section. £4.5M request from Town Deal fund.

Formation of a Board and Committee underway. Resort event programme and marketing campaign will be enhanced to support the BID. Impact of the Tourism bid will provide an opportunity to request sponsorship from Blackpool's key brands to increase funding on top of the levy.
