1. Purpose of the Report

To provide an update on interim further survey undertaken on which an oral update will be given at the meeting.

2. Recommendation

For the Board to review and comment on the report.

3. Background

As previously reported to the Board. Whilst the number of respondents to the Commonplace survey was significant, there was a lack of submissions from community members with protected characteristics. In response to this issue, an amended survey was developed and an additional engagement exercise was carried out. This included targeted engagement with VCSE organisations alongside an offer of training to staff to support the facilitation of the survey. The aim of this additional exercise was to promote the inclusivity of the survey, with particular reference to the groups of people who are routinely excluded from engagement activity. A short report of this exercise is outlined below.

4. Interim report for the Short Town Deal Survey

99 respondents fed back to us – all online. This link has been distributed through 3rd sector and volunteer based organisations rather than online through the social media channels/Blackpool Council website. During this period it has also been amended so that groups of people can feed back as well as individuals.

Key themes from the responses are listed in the short-report below but one key over-arching theme is that the residents want to hear more about the projects.

Demographics

When compared with the respondents for Commonplace the gap between female and male respondents has narrowed although overall there are still slightly more male respondents. Other categories such as those who have a disability, non-white ethnicities, young people and non-heterosexual categories have slightly increased numbers.
