The Department for Transport document entitled "Statutory Guidance for Highway Authority Permit Schemes", dated October 2015, states in Section 1.24 "Schemes should comply with and use the current version of the Electronic Transfer of Notifications (EToN) protocol".

Also, Item 1 of the "Checklist for senior officer approval for finalising a permit scheme" in Annex B of the document defines a requirement for "an assurance of EToN Compliance".
