Blackpool Food Bank

Borrow It Blackpool

<u>Borrow It Blackpool</u> is a community powered membership scheme from the Volunteer Centre Blackpool, Wyre and Fylde where donated or sponsored items are loaned to members for a small fee. Items that are available to borrow include household eletricals, gardening and DIY tools and leisure goods. The scheme has a range of <u>volunteering opportunities</u> available - plus you can donate money and your used items to the scheme.

Shared Lives

The **Shared Lives** service matches local people with:

- Adults with learning disabilities

Anyone can be a Shared Lives carer and the team are looking for new people to join the team. You don't need qualifications or experience; just kindness, patience and a willingness to share your time and home.

Full training will be provided and there is a generous allowance for your time. To apply, make an initial enquiry via the enquiry form.

At Home Library Service

The At Home Library Service is available for Blackpool residents who are unable to visit their local library due to illness, age or disability.

This much valued service is run with the help of volunteers.
