Eligibility criteria	Each application is determined on its own merits.

Application Evaluation Process	<p>Fees are based on the quantity of petroleum to be stored:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Up to but not exceeding 2500 litres (500 gallons) of petroleum or 2500 kilos of carbide of calcium is £42 including VAT • Exceeding 2500 litres or 2500 kilos but not exceeding 50,000 litres or 50,000 kilos is £58 including VAT • Exceeding 50,000 litres or 50,000 kilos is £120 including VAT <p>The premises will be inspected by Health and Safety prior to the licence being granted. Blackpool Council's current policy is to grant licences for 1 year.</p>
Will Tacit Consent Apply?	No. It is in the public interest that Blackpool Council must process your application before it can be granted. If you have not heard from us within a reasonable period, please contact us. You can do this by emailing licensing@blackpool.gov.uk
Failed Application Redress	<p>Please contact Blackpool Council Licensing Service in the first instance.</p> <p>If an application is refused the applicant may appeal to the Secretary of State.</p>
