

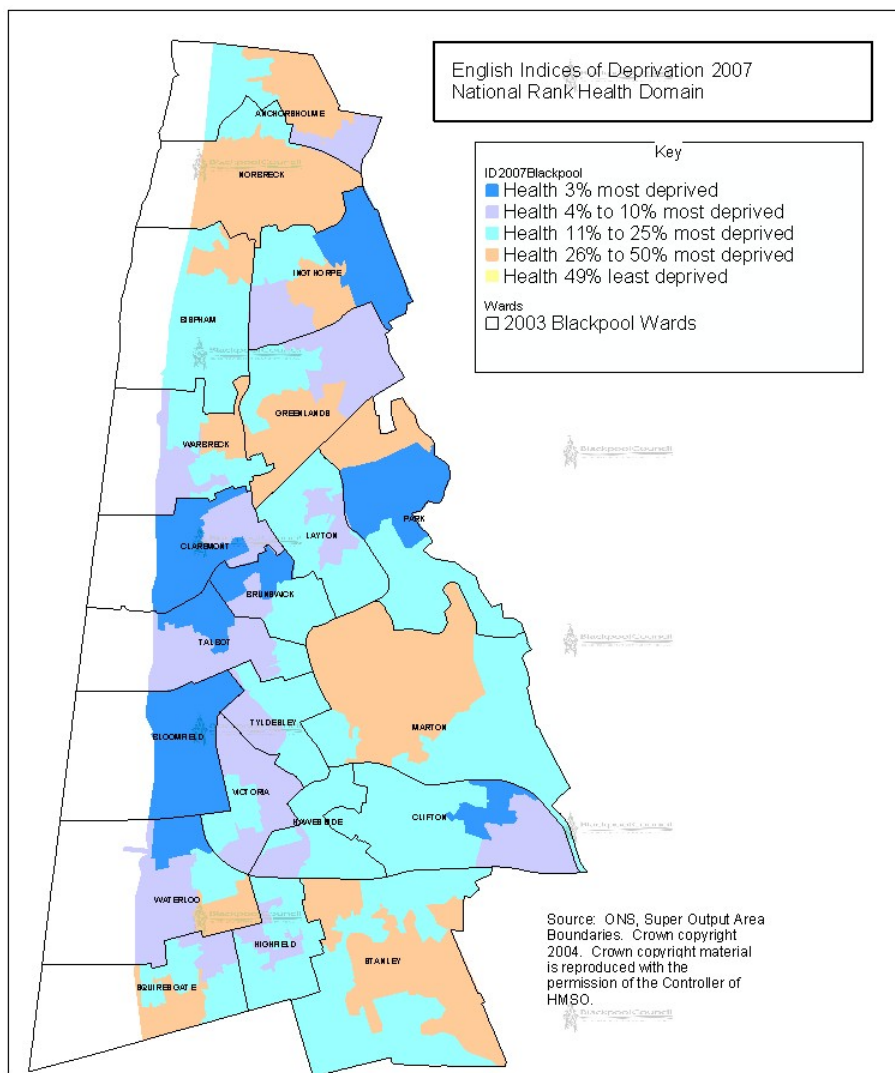
English Indices of Deprivation 2007: Health Deprivation and Disability Domain

Key Facts

- Blackpool has 39 localities within the most deprived 10% in England and of these 17 are within the 3% most deprived in England.

English Indices of Deprivation 2007: Health Deprivation and Disability Domain

This domain measures rates of poor health, early mortality and disability in an area and covers the entire age range. Measures include Years of Potential Life Lost, Comparative Illness and Disability Ratio and measure of Acute Morbidity derived from Hospital Episode Statistics, and the proportion of adults under 60 suffering from mood or anxiety disorders based on prescribing, Hospital Episode Statistics and Incapacity Benefit data.

## Health

The map shows the location of pockets of high health deprivation in comparison to other parts of England. These are within the Wards of Park, Clifton, Ingthorpe, Bloomfield, Talbot, Claremont, Waterloo and Brunswick where there are areas within the 3% most deprived nationally. The whole of Bloomfield Ward falls within the 3% most deprived nationally.

Table 13 shows that poor health is a major concern in Blackpool. 39 of Blackpool's Lower Super Output Areas are in the 10% most deprived in England, and of these, 17 are in the 3% most deprived for health deprivation. All 94 are within the 40% most deprived nationally.

LSOA Lower-Layer Super Output Area

A “Lower-layer Super Output Areas (LSOA)” is a small, standardised geographical division, created by the Office for National Statistics, for collecting and dissemination of local area statistics. Each LSOA is designed to average some 1,500 residents within a minimum of 400 households; there are either four or five to each of the 21 Blackpool electoral wards and 94 LSOAs make-up the Blackpool Council administrative area. There are 32,482 LSOAs in England.
