A-levels

A-levels are best suited to 16 to 19 year-olds who enjoy classroom learning and exploring subjects in depth. You will typically choose a small handful of subjects to study. A-levels are a great stepping stone if you're thinking of moving into higher education, such as university.

You must have completed your GCSEs (minimum of 5 at grades 4-9) to enroll on to an A-level course.

Jobs or volunteering with training

Working or volunteering 20+ hours a week? That's a great way to build experience and develop new skills.

If you're under 18, you also need to meet the Raising the Participation Age requirements. This means that having a job alone isn't enough, you need to be taking part in some form of education or training as well.

Don't worry, though. Many employers already include training as part of the job, such as inductions, health and safety courses, apprenticeships, or role-specific training. You could also study part-time alongside your job or volunteering role.

The training you complete can help you gain valuable skills, boost your confidence, work towards qualifications and prepare for your future career. So while you're earning, volunteering, or gaining experience, you're also continuing to learn and keeping your options

open for the future.
