Our service helps to facilitate discharges from hospital and residential settings as part of the discharge to assess model and subscribes to a competency based trusted assessor approach. This approach enables individuals to be assessed within their home environment and identify any equipment that may be required to meet their needs.

We provide a range of services that also include palliative care, primary night care, rapid response and bridging care and work in partnership with a range of professionals to ensure a collaborative approach to our care delivery.

We have a skilled workforce that receive regular mandatory training to ensure that all our staff have the right knowledge, skills and abilities to undertake their role to a high standard. We provide tailored support in areas such as the administration of medication, personal care, meal preparation and domestic cleans, ensuring that the person is at the center of everything we do.

We excel in meeting the requirements of individuals with complex and challenging care needs.

The homecare and re-ablement service is regulated and inspected by the Care Quality Commission.
