Over 60s and disabled bus pass

The travel pass scheme in Blackpool and Lancashire is operated by NoWcards.

This allows free local bus travel for those eligible from 9.30am until 11.00pm Monday to Friday, and all day Saturday, Sunday and bank holidays, across England.

Blackpool residents can also benefit from free travel on the full route of the Blackpool Tramway. Passes issued by other local authorities are not valid on the Blackpool Tramway.

You qualify for a NoWcard if you:

- Are an older person
- Are blind or partially sighted
- Are profoundly or severely deaf
- Are without speech
- Have a walking disability
- Have lost the use of both arms
- Have a learning disability
- Been refused grant of a driving licence to drive a motor vehicle under part III of the Road Traffic Act 1988, or would be refused pursuant to section 92 of the Act (physical fitness), otherwise than on the ground of persistence misuse of drugs or alcohol

Age of eligibility

The age of eligibility for concessionary travel is tied to the pensionable age.

As the pensionable age for women gradually increases so too will the age of eligibility for concessionary travel increase for both men and women. The age of eligibility for concessionary travel is therefore

- For women = pensionable age
- For men = pensionable age of a woman born on the same day

Applying for a NoWcard

If your main residence is in Blackpool you can apply for your bus pass online.

You will need the following:

- Proof of your name and current address you can use your council tax bill or a utility bill such as your gas, electric or water bill for this
- Proof of your date of birth (example, your birth certificate or driving licence)
- Evidence of your disability if you are applying for a Disabled pass

Customer First drop-in sessions

Customer First are now offering drop in sessions at a number of libraries across the town. The sessions run between 10.0am and 12 noon and they will be able to help you with your NoWcard application.

Travel on trams

Please note that free travel on Blackpool trams will only be available to holders or cards issued by Blackpool Council or Lancashire County Council residents within Wyre Council.

Lost or stolen passes

If you lose or damage your bus pass, you can order a replacement by <u>clicking here</u>. There is a £10 charge for a replacement pass.

Please note we can only issue replacement bus passes for Blackpool residents. If your pass was issued by another local authority then you will need to <u>contact them for information on how to replace your pass</u>.


