Criteria for selection of buildings

The criteria against which heritage assets in Blackpool will be evaluated for inclusion on the local list are:

- Age
- Rarity
- Aesthetic or design merit
- Group value
- Archaeological interest
- Historical interest
- Landmark status
- Social value
