The Biodiversity Duty Report is a statutory duty that requires all local authorities to report their approach to conservation and enhancing biodiversity. This duty ensures that nature is considered in decision-making and that action is taken to protect and improve local habitats and wildlife.

As part of this requirement, the council must publish a Biodiversity Duty Report and review progress every five years.
