# Voter ID

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections.

## Forms of ID that can be used to vote

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional license)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- Biometric Immigration document
- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

## If you don't have an accepted form photo ID

If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

**Apply for a voter authority certificate**

Alternatively, you can complete a paper application form and send this to the electoral services team.

You need to be [registered to vote](#) before you apply for a Voter Authority Certificate.
