Local plan part 1: Core strategy

The core strategy is a key planning document for Blackpool. It sets out where new development (including housing, employment, retail and leisure) should be located to meet Blackpool's future needs to 2027. It was adopted by the council on the 20 January 2016.

It also identifies areas which will be regenerated, protected or enhanced and sets out the key development principles such as design and affordable housing.

The core strategy along with the [Local Plan Part 2](#) will be used to determine planning applications and priorities for the town over the plan period (2012-2027).
